

The Perfect Storm, Ice Cold: WLA-RP Table Top Exercise Webcast

No power, no phones, ice-covered roads, microbiological and chemical water contamination, multiple contamination sites, no in-house capability to detect suspected contaminants, calls from the press, incident command system established...

Course Description: This webcast is designed as a “virtual training course,” delivering a complete learning experience that includes facilitated interaction between students and instructors.

The webcast will be led by two facilitators who will present background information and a water contamination scenario to students. Participants will be presented with situations and questions stemming from the scenario that they will address based on their real-life experiences and knowledge of the Water Laboratory Alliance Response Plan (WLA-RP) and Water Security tools including the Water Contaminant Information Tool, *Selected Analytical Methods for Environmental Remediation and Recovery*, and the Laboratory Compendium.
