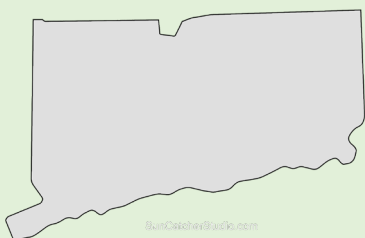




Incorporating Asset Management in Drinking Water Regulations

Thursday, October 14th 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. EST

The America's Water Infrastructure Act amends the Safe Water Drinking Act and requires the state's capacity development strategies to include a description of how they will encourage the development of asset management plans and include any training, technical assistance, and other activities to help implement asset management plans. During this webinar, you'll hear how Connecticut, New Jersey, and Ohio promotes the development and implementation of asset management by incorporating it into their regulations.



Connecticut requires small community water systems (serving between 25 and 1,000) to have a fiscal and asset management plan.



New Jersey requires public water systems with greater than 500 service connections to implement an asset management plan.



Ohio requires public water systems to have an asset management program, as well as track and report metrics of implementation.
