[WaterOperator.org](#) provides operators and water professionals with easy access to relevant, industry-specific information from over 800 organizations serving states, tribes, and territories, all in one place. Developed in 2010 to specifically support the unique challenges of small and rural communities, publicly available resources such as capacity development manuals, cybersecurity guidance and much more, are indexed and presented in a free, searchable library.

[Water Professionals International \(WPI\)](#) (formerly known as the Association of Boards of Certification) includes over 100 certifying authorities representing more than 40 states, 10 Canadian provinces and territories, and several international and tribal programs. WPI has assists in the certification of water and wastewater treatment professionals, including those who earn a WPI Certification or Professional Operator (PO) Certification.

[Rural Community Assistance Partnership \(RCAP\)](#) is a national network of regional nonprofit partners with a team of technical assistance providers across the country who work with water and wastewater systems in rural communities.

[USDA Rural Development Water & Waste Disposal Loan & Grant Program](#) provides funding for clean and reliable drinking water systems, sanitary sewage disposal, sanitary solid waste disposal, and storm water drainage to households and businesses in eligible rural areas.
